Steve holds an MSc in engineering and management; is a Chartered Engineer, Chartered Marine Engineer, a Fellow member of the Institute of Marine Engineering Science & Technology and a member of the Association for Project Management. In his current role, Steve and his team are tasked to identify, assess and where successful, implement innovation and technology to improve delivery of waterfront support to the Royal Navy.
